List of Modal Verbs/Examples

- 1. Can: I can speak English fluently.
- 2. Could: Sara could solve the Math problems easily.
- 3. May: You may leave if you finish your work.
- 4. Might: It might rain tomorrow.
- 5. Shall: I shall attend the departmental meeting.
- 6. Should: You should try delicious cheese cake.
- 7. Will: I will finish my homework tonight.
- 8. Would: I would love to travel to Italy.
- 9. Must: You must follow the school rules.
- 10. Ought: You ought to apologize for your mistake.
