About the

Institution

Sadiq Public School was founded by His Highness Sir Sadiq Mohammad Khan Abbasi, Ameer of Bahawalpur, who laid its foundation stone on March 4, 1953. He provided 450 acres of land and funded the entire project, supervised by his Chief Minister, Makhdoomzada Hassan Mahmud. Inaugurated on January 18, 1954, with 37 students and 7 teachers, it quickly expanded under Principal Khan Anwar Sikandar Khan. Originally co-educational, SPS temporarily stopped admitting girls in 1966, but a separate Girls' Section was launched in 2003, now serving 700+ students. The school's infrastructure includes academic blocks, boarding houses, pools, sports facilities, and a riding club. With 2100+ students and a commitment to holistic education, SPS offers both local and Cambridge streams. The Progressive School offers free education to 350+ children of support staff.

Today, SPS stands as a beacon of excellence, echoing its founder's vision—fostering discipline, academics, sports, clubs, and service across Pakistan.

Modules

This event brings together a diverse set of modules designed to challenge, inspire, and engage participants across multiple disciplines. From hands-on engineering tasks to scientific problem-solving, creative expression, and digital innovation, each module offers a unique opportunity to apply knowledge, think critically, and collaborate effectively in a competitive yet educational environment.

Module #1 (Programming)

HACKATHON

Ready to turn your wildest ideas into impactful digital reality? In this fast-paced hackathon, teams will brainstorm, prototype, and pitch mobile or web apps for good—ranging from study tools to eco-solutions. Use Figma, flowcharts, and your big brain to shine. It's all about creativity, collaboration, and code.

Module #2 (Forensics)

CRIME INVESTIGATION DEPARTMENT

Step into the shoes of a forensic investigator in CID, where participants will analyze a simulated crime scene. Using scientific reasoning, observation skills, and logical deduction, participants must follow a trail of cleverly hidden clues to identify the true culprit among a pool of suspects. This module rewards sharp thinking, teamwork, and keen attention to detail.



Module #3 (Architecture)

TRUSS WARS

Put your engineering instincts to the test in Truss Wars, where students will construct bridges using basic materials under strict design constraints. Structures will be tested on both aesthetic design and load-bearing capacity. May the best blend of science and structure win!

Module #4 (Electronics)

SPARKH

SparkX challenges participants to demonstrate their grasp of electrical engineering by constructing functional circuits using standard lab apparatus. Working from schematic diagrams, teams must race against the clock to complete and test their circuits in this electrifying test of speed and accuracy.

Module #5 (Mechanics)

FORGE

The ultimate hands-on challenge. In Forge, participants will design and build physical systems to accomplish specific tasks using given components. From safely landing eggs from tall buildings to creating smart design strategies using electrical components, this is where builders and tinkerers show their true ingenuity.
